One member of the unit will portray Theodore Roosevelt and another will portray Lt. Col. Arthur Freemantle, an officer who survived the Battle of Gettysburg during the U.S. Civil War. Women's Clothing, 1770-1870 - The ladies of John Payne's Company of Kentucky Light Dragoons share their knowledge of women's clothing typical of the years between 1770 and 1870.
